On January 19, 2016, **MARC STEVEN COLEN** ("Respondent"), filed a petition seeking payment of disciplinary costs in the amount of \$2,609.32 by making an initial \$300 payment (which Respondent states he made with his 2016 State Bar member dues), twelve monthly payments of \$50 each (beginning February 28, 2016), and a final payment of \$1,709.32 to be made by February 28, 2017. Respondent's motion was based on financial hardship. On January 21, 2016, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California ("State Bar"), by and through Senior Trial Counsel, Charles A. Murray, filed a response opposing the relief sought by Respondent. Respondent filed a reply to the State Bar's response on January 27, 2016. Respondent's response attached supporting declarations and exhibits.


After reviewing the parties' pleadings, the Court issues the following orders:

1. For good cause shown, Respondent's request to extend the time to comply with the order to pay disciplinary costs is **GRANTED**. However, rather than paying the outstanding disciplinary costs on an installment basis, the court orders that Respondent's outstanding disciplinary costs associated with case no. 04-O-11994 and consolidated matters, shall be paid with Respondent's annual State Bar membership fees for the year 2017.

2. The court further orders that, if Respondent fails to pay the disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules Proc. Of State Bar, rule 5.134. The payment of costs remains enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.
