WAIVER OF VARIANCE BETWEEN NOTICE OF DISCIPLINARY CHARGES AND STIPULATED FACTS AND CULPABILITY:

The parties waive any variance between the Notice of Disciplinary Charges filed on August 24, 2005, and the facts and/or conclusions of law contained in this stipulation and waive the issuance of an Amended Notice of Disciplinary Charges. The parties further waive the right to the filing of an Amended Notice of Disciplinary Charges and to a formal hearing on any charge not included in the pending Notice of Disciplinary Charges.

FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Respondent admits that the following facts are true and that she is culpable of violations of the specified statutes and/or Rules of Professional Conduct.

04-O-15002

Facts:

- 1. On June 25, 2004, Carol Lim ("Lim") retained Respondent to handle the dissolution of her marriage with Hoon Lim. On that date, Lim paid Respondent \$3,800 in advanced fees.
- 2. On June 26, 2004, Respondent sent Lim a letter requesting that she sign the back of the Dissolution Petition, the Declaration Under Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act and the Application for Order and Supporting Declaration. Respondent requested that Lim return the documents to her for filing. Lim signed the forms and sent them back to Respondent.
- 3. On or about July 19, 2004, Respondent was incarcerated on an unrelated matter and was therefore, not able to perform any services on behalf of Lim. She was released on or about September 25, 2004.
- 4. On or about October 7, 2004, Lim terminated Respondent's services and requested a refund of unearned fees.
- 5. Respondent did not file any documents on behalf of Lim and did not earn all of the advanced fees. Respondent did not return any portion of Lim's advanced fees.

Conclusions of Law:

By not refunding any portion of the \$3,800 advanced fees, Respondent failed to promptly refund fees that had not been earned in violation of rule 3-700(D)(2) of the Rules of Professional Conduct.

04-0-15589

Facts:

- 1. On October 8, 2004, Saeed Khadem ("Khadem") retained Respondent to handle his dissolution of marriage and paid her advanced fees of \$5,000.
- 2. On October 9, 2004, Khadem told Respondent he had changed his mind about getting a divorce.
- 3. On about October 18, 2004, Respondent was incarcerated on an unrelated matter. She was not released until September 25, 2007.
- 4. On October 21, 2004, Khadem terminated Respondent's services and requested a refund of any unearned fees.
- 5. Respondent did not earn any of the advanced fees. Respondent did not refund any of the advanced fees.

Conclusions of Law:

By not refunding the \$5,000 advanced fees, Respondent failed to promptly refund fees that had not been earned in violation of rule 3-700(D)(2) of the Rules of Professional Conduct.

AUTHORITIES SUPPORTING DISCIPLINE.

To determine the appropriate level of discipline, the standards provide guidance. (*Drociak v. State Bar* (1991) 52 Cal. 3d 1085; *Matter of Sampson* (1994) 3 Cal. State Bar Ct. Rptr. 119.) Also, the recommended discipline must rest upon a balanced consideration of relevant factors. (*Sampson, supra,* 3 Cal. State Bar Ct. Rptr. 119.)

Standard 1.3 provides that the primary purposes of attorney discipline are, "the protection of the public, the courts and the legal profession; the maintenance of high legal professional standards by attorneys and the preservation of public confidence in the legal profession."

Standard 2.10 applies to violations of Rule 3-700(D)(2). It requires reproval or suspension according to the gravity of the offense or harm to the victim, and with due regard for the purposes of imposing discipline.

DISMISSALS.

The parties respectfully request the Court to dismiss the following alleged violations in the interest of justice:
