On August 16, 2013, petitioner **Arthur Egbert Fisher** sought relief from or an extension of time to comply with the order assessing disciplinary costs in State Bar Court Case No. 05-O-00089 on the grounds of financial hardship. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.130(B).) On August 13, 2010, Donald R. Steedman of the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (State Bar) filed opposition thereto to which respondent replied on August 22, 2013.

After reviewing the parties' pleadings, the court issues the following orders:

1. Petitioner's motion for relief from payment of disciplinary costs is **DENIED**, no good cause having been shown; and
2. Petitioner's motion for extension of time to comply with the order to pay disciplinary costs is **GRANTED**. The court orders that petitioner's time to pay the disciplinary costs associated with State Bar Court Case No. 05-O-00089 be extended by four years from the date of filing of the present order. In view of petitioner's financial hardship and good cause appearing,



the court **ORDERS** petitioner to pay the disciplinary costs in four equal installments along with his membership fees commencing with the 2014 billing cycle. In accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, one-fourth of the costs must be paid with petitioner's membership fees for the years 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017.

It is further **ORDERED** that if petitioner fails to pay any installment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134.) The payment of costs is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.


