# IN THE MATTER OF **RICHARD JOHN RUSZAT II, State Bar number 220432,** A MEMBER OF THE STATE BAR OF CALIFORNIA

Since respondent **RICHARD JOHN RUSZAT II**, **State Bar number 220432**, has been convicted of violating Penal Code section 245, subdivision (a)(1), a felony which may or may not involve moral turpitude, and Penal Code section 422, a felony for which there is probable cause to believe that it involves moral turpitude, under the authority of rule 9.10(a) of the California Rules of Court, it is ordered pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6102 that respondent be suspended from the practice of law, effective March 15, 2007, pending final disposition of this proceeding. It is further ordered that respondent comply with rule 9.20 of the California Rules of Court and perform the acts specified in paragraphs (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of this suspension.
