Since respondent **ADAM RANALD FAIRBAIRN**, State Bar number 168204, has been convicted of violating Penal Code sections 245, subdivision (a)(2) and 246.3, felonies which may or may not involve moral turpitude, under the authority of California Rules of Court, rule 9.10(a), it is ordered pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6102 that respondent be suspended from the practice of law, effective November 24, 2008, pending final disposition of this proceeding.¹ It is further ordered that respondent comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20 and perform the acts specified in paragraphs (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 to 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of this suspension.


