ORDER

On July 27, 2012, respondent filed a motion to delay commencement of actual suspension pending completion of the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination, and relief to file a late motion. On July 30, 2012, we filed an order temporarily staying the suspension to allow time to rule on respondent's motion, and a response, if any, by the State Bar Office of Probation. On August 2, 2012, the Office of Probation filed its opposition.

We grant respondent's request to file her motion late. Finding no good cause, the motion to delay commencement of actual suspension is denied. The temporary stay is lifted, and respondent is ordered suspended, effective September 1, 2012, and she will remain suspended until she provides the Office of Probation with satisfactory proof that she has taken and passed the examination.
