**ORDERS:**

**Respondent's Motion for Extension of Time to Pay Costs**

On February 16, 2012, Respondent filed a motion seeking an extension of time regarding his obligation to pay costs. On February 28, 2012, the State Bar filed its statement of opposition to the motion to extend the time to pay costs.

Respondent is currently ineligible to practice law and has been since November 8, 2007. He is currently receiving financial assistance under the Food Stamps Program. Although he received money from a parent in the past to cover one of his then-due installment payments for costs, Respondent presented documentary evidence showing that those monies were seized by another creditor before they could be paid to the State Bar.

GOOD CAUSE has been shown for extending the time for Respondent to pay costs. Accordingly, the costs that remain outstanding will now be paid in equal installments over the four billing cycles beginning in 2013. More specifically, one-fourth of the disciplinary costs must be paid prior to February 1, 2013; one-fourth of the costs must be paid prior to February 1, 2014; one-fourth of the costs must be paid prior to February 1, 2015; and one-fourth of the costs must be paid prior to February 1, 2016. If Respondent fails to pay any of the above installment payments more than 10 days after its due date without the prior written approval of the State Bar or a further order of this court, the remaining unpaid balance of the costs will be due immediately and be enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.


