ORDERS:


Respondent's Motion for Relief from or Extension of Time to Pay Costs

On January 3, 2012, Respondent filed a motion for relief from the Supreme Court's order assessing costs. On January 23, 2012, the State Bar filed its statement of non-opposition to the motion to extend the time to pay costs. A comparable motion was made and granted last year, with no opposition from the State Bar.

Respondent is disbarred from the practice of law; has just gone through bankruptcy; is largely unemployed; is receiving county relief; and has an ongoing obligation to pay \$6,190.50 in costs. GOOD CAUSE has been shown for both extending the time to pay such costs and creating an installment plan for such repayment. Accordingly, the costs that remain outstanding will now be paid in equal annual installments beginning on July 1, 2012. More specifically, one-third of the disciplinary costs must be paid on or before July 1, 2012; one-third of the costs must be paid on or before July 1, 2013; and one-third of the costs must be paid on or before July 1, 2014. If Respondent fails to pay any of the above installment payments more than 10 days after its due date without the prior written approval of the State Bar or a further order of this court, the remaining unpaid balance of the costs will be due immediately and be enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
