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On February 14, 2014, respondent William George Schweizer, by and through his counsel of record, Scott J. Drexel (Drexel), filed a motion requesting that the court grant an extension of time for respondent to pay the discipline costs assessed against him in the above-referenced proceeding. Specifically, respondent requests that the court grant an extension of time to pay the discipline costs in the above-captioned matter in four equal installments, with the first payment due with his annual membership fees for the year 2014, and the remaining annual installment fees to be paid fees with his annual membership fees for the years 2015, 2016, and 2017.

Respondent’s motion is based upon financial hardship and is accompanied by his “Financial Declaration in Support of Motion for . . . Extension of Time to Pay Disciplinary Costs.” In an email to Drexel, dated February 10, 2014, Senior Trial Counsel Brian Tady, representing the State Bar, states that based upon respondent’s financial declaration, the State Bar does not oppose respondent’s request for an extension of time that would enable him to pay

his discipline costs in this proceeding in four annual installments. Thereafter, the State Bar filed no response or opposition to respondent's motion.

Having considered respondent's motion and the State Bar's non-opposition thereto, the court finds that respondent has established hardship, special circumstances, and other good cause under rule 5.130(B) of the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar.

However, as the time to pay discipline costs for the year 2014 had already passed at the time of the filing of respondent's motion, the court, sua sponte, orders that the time in which respondent must pay his discipline costs is extended, so that respondent is required to pay his discipline costs in four equal installments, the first of which will become due and payable with his annual membership fees for the year **2015**; respondent, thereafter, must pay the three remaining discipline cost installment payments with his annual membership fees for the years **2016, 2017, and 2018**.

It is further **ORDERED** that if respondent fails to pay any installment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately, unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134.) The payment of costs is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

Respondent must comply with all other orders and requirements as set forth in Supreme Court order No. S208466 (State Bar Court Nos. 08-O-12108 (09-O-13300; 09-O-17599)).

IT IS SO ORDERED.
