

Since respondent **MICHAEL STEPHEN KEREKES, State Bar Number 130267**, has been convicted of violating 18 United States Code section 371 (conspiracy to violate title 26 United States Code sections 7201, 7206(1), 7206(2) and 7212(a)), a felony involving moral turpitude, and title 26 United States Code section 7201, a felony for which there is probable cause to believe involves moral turpitude, under the authority of rule 9.10(a), California Rules of Court, it is ordered pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6102 that respondent be suspended from the practice of law effective July 17, 2009, pending final disposition of this proceeding. It is further ordered that respondent comply with rule 9.20, California Rules of Court, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of this suspension.


