On April 21, 2014, respondent Jon Eric Gelb filed a motion for relief from payment of costs or, in the alternative, an extension of time in which to pay disciplinary costs (motion), based on financial hardship in the above-captioned matter.

On April 22, 2014, the State Bar of California, Office of the Chief Trial Counsel (State Bar), by and through Assistant Chief Trial Counsel Dane C. Dauphine, filed a response to respondent's motion, opposing respondent's request for relief in whole from payment of costs and his request for an extension of time in which to pay the disciplinary costs.

Having carefully considered respondent's motion and the State Bar's response, the court finds that respondent's financial condition does not warrant that he be granted relief in whole from payment of costs, but, warrants an extension of time in which to pay the balance of the costs still owing in the above-captioned matter.

Accordingly, respondent's motion is granted, in part, and denied, in part. Respondent's motion for relief in whole from payment of costs is **DENIED**. Respondent's motion for an

extension of time in which to pay the costs in the instant matter is **GRANTED** as follows:

respondent must pay the disciplinary costs still owing in the above-captioned matter in two equal installments with his annual State Bar membership fees for the years 2015 and 2016.

If respondent fails to pay any installment when due, the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately. The payment of costs remains enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**


