



Since respondent Leonor Pereira, State Bar Number 228204, has been convicted of violating title 18 United States Code section 4 (misprision of conspiracy to participate in racketeering in violation of title 18 United States Code section 1962(d)), a felony involving moral turpitude, under the authority of rule 9.10(a), California Rules of Court, it is ordered pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6102 that respondent be suspended from the practice of law effective June 14, 2010, pending final disposition of this proceeding. It is further ordered that respondent comply with rule 9.20, California Rules of Court, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of this suspension.


