Due to the administrative action against Arturo Sandoval ("respondent") the State Bar is assessing disciplinary costs of \$4,894.00 due on February 1, 2016, along with respondent's 2016 Annual membership fee of \$430.00. Due to Mr. Sandoval's income statement and financial disclosure (see attached Declaration of Arturo Sandoval in Support of Stipulation Regarding 2016 Reinstatement fee) the parties hereby stipulate and agree to "extend the time to pay these costs on grounds of hardship, special circumstances or other good cause." respondent will be able to pay the \$4,894.00 in three installments of \$1,631.33 each over the next three calendar years as follows: 1st installment of \$1,631.33 due on February 1, 2016, 2nd installment of \$1,631.33 due on February 1, 2017, and the third installment of \$1,631.34 due on February 1, 2018.

Thus, the parties further hereby stipulate and agree that for the current calendar year 2016 respondent's fees due to the State Bar for Membership fees will be \$430.00 (2016 Annual

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DECLARATION OF ARTURO SANDOVAL IN SUPPORT OF STIPULATION REGARDING PAYING DISCIPLINARY COSTS IN INSTALLMENTS

I, Arturo E. Sandoval, declare as follows:

- 1. I am an attorney at law, duly licensed to practice before all the courts of the State of California. I submit this declaration in support of the stipulation to pay the administrative fee owed to the State Bar of California of \$4,894.00 in three installments of \$1,631.33 each over the next three calendar years as follows: 1st installment of \$1,631.33 due on February 1, 2016, 2nd installment of \$1,631.33 due on February 1, 2017, and the third installment of \$1,631.34 due on February 1, 2018. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated herein, and if called upon would and could competently testify thereto.
- 2. It would be a hardship for me based on my current income to pay the entire amount owed of \$4,894.00 because my income compared to current necessary living expenses it not enough to pay the entire \$4,894.00 in one lump sum.
- 3. My current net income is \$2,798.88 per pay period (every two weeks).
- 4. From that income I pay \$1,425.00 every month for child support for my two minor children (9 years old and 11 years old) per court order. In addition I also pay an additional \$600 to \$650 per month for afterschool childcare for both minor children.
- 5. Medical expenses for both of my children amount to approximately \$200-250 per month in medical insurance and medical care, dental and health.
- 6. My current monthly mortgage and HOA payments amount to \$980.27 for the house I live in.
- 7. I also have a second mortgage that is in the amount of \$2,679.95 per month.
- 8. I also have my two children in my physical custody 30-40% of the time as I share legal and joint custody with my ex-wife. Expenses for the children, clothes, food, etc. amount to approximately \$200-\$300 per month.
- 9. My electricity/power expenses amount to approximately \$180 per month.

- 10. My own personal expenses for food, gas for my automobile for work related purposes, amounts to approximately \$300-\$400 per month. My current savings account has approximately \$2,500 in it.
- 11. Thus, it would be a hardship for me to pay the \$4,894.00 in one lump sum.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the state of California that the foregoing is true and correct and that this declaration was executed on January 27, 2016, at Oakland, California.
