Respondent Stephen Douglas Smith has been convicted of violating Virginia Code section 18.2-374.1:1 (knowing possession of child pornography), a felony that does not inherently involve moral turpitude, but may involve moral turpitude or other misconduct warranting discipline based on the facts and circumstances surrounding the conviction. Under rule 9.10(a) of the California Rules of Court, it is ordered that Smith be suspended from the practice of law effective December 10, 2010, pending final disposition of this proceeding. It is further ordered that Smith comply with rule 9.20, California Rules of Court, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of this suspension.


