This matter is before the court on the motion for involuntary inactive enrollment that the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (hereafter OCTC) filed on April 2, 2010. In its motion, OCTC seeks to have Attorney SEAN CURTIS HICKEY involuntarily enrolled as an inactive member of the State Bar of California under Business and Professions Code section 6007, subdivision (b)(2). OCTC properly served a copy of its motion on Attorney Hickey. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 411(b).) But Attorney Hickey did not file a response to the motion.

Attorney Hickey's law practice. (See order filed July 30, 2009, in *In the Matter of the Assumption of Jurisdiction Over the Law Practice of Sean Hickey, State Bar Membership No.*159116, Alameda County Superior Court case number RG 09443793.) The superior court

assumed jurisdiction over Hickey's practice under Business and Professions Code section 6190

et seq. The superior court's order does not provide for any exceptions to the court's assumption

of jurisdiction over Hickey's practice (i.e., the court assumed jurisdiction over Hickey's entire

practice).

This court finds that the evidence clearly and convincingly shows that an order

involuntarily enrolling Attorney Hickey as an inactive member of the State Bar of California is

appropriate under Business and Professions Code section 6007, subdivision (b)(2). (Rules Proc.

of State Bar, rule 412(a).)

ORDER

The court orders that OCTC's April 2, 2010 motion for involuntary inactive enrollment is

GRANTED. Accordingly, the court further orders that Attorney SEAN CURTIS HICKEY be

involuntarily enrolled as an inactive member of the State Bar of California (Bus. & Prof. Code,

§ 6007, subd. (b)(2)) effective three days after service of this order by mail (Rules Proc. of State

Bar, rule 414).
