Crime(s) of which convicted and classification(s): Violation of Health & Safety Code § 11364 (Possession of Paraphernalia Used for Narcotics), one count, a misdemeanor which may or may not involve moral turpitude or other misconduct warranting discipline. A review of applicable case law did not find any cases which suggest that this crime is moral turpitude per se. Previous rulings by this court looked at the underlying facts and circumstances in making a determination as to whether the offense constituted moral turpitude. The State Bar will inform the Court upon finality of the conviction.

3. Compliance with Rule 9.20. (Applicable only if checked.)

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
