Response of Geoffrey J. Gnadt

Judge McElroy:

Please accept the following as my response to the initiating document in the above matter. It is my position that the acts forming the basis of my conviction for misdemeanor battery - domestic violence do not constitute acts of moral turpitude.

I recognize that my conduct was not acceptable. Candidly, I admit that some sort of reprimand by the State Bar of California is appropriate here.

I am hopeful that the Court will agree with the Wisconsin Office of Lawyer Regulation that a license suspension or other more severe discipline is not warranted here. There are a number of mitigating factors which weigh in support of this outcome: I have no prior disciplinary history. I have been cooperative and forthcoming in dealing with the State Bar of California. I have also taken action to correct the medical and behavioral health concerns that were affecting me at the time of this incident. This incident bears no relationship to my actions as a practicing lawyer. I have taken responsibility for my actions in the criminal matter by pleading guilty to this charge.
