On May 26, 2015, respondent Terence Wynn Isobe, by and through his attorney, Steven H. Berniker, filed a motion for relief from payment of costs awarded in the above-captioned disciplinary matter or, in the alternative, an extension of time in which to pay disciplinary costs (motion) on the grounds of financial hardship.

On June 2, 2015, the State Bar of California, Office of the Chief Trial Counsel (State Bar), by and through Supervising Senior Trial Counsel Susan Chan, filed a response to respondent's motion, opposing his request for relief from payment of the assessed disciplinary costs, but stating its non-opposition to the granting of an extension of time to pay the disciplinary costs in installments in the years 2015 - 2018.

Having considered the parties' contentions, the court DENIES the motion for relief from costs; but, alternatively, on the grounds of financial hardship, GRANTS an extension of time to pay the costs awarded in the above-captioned matter in three annual installments, commencing

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with respondent's membership fees in 2016. Therefore, in accordance with Business and

Professions Code section 6086.10, one-third of the costs must be paid with respondent's

membership fees for the years 2016, 2017, and 2018.

It is further ordered that if respondent does not pay any installment of disciplinary costs

within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to section

6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately

unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California. (Rules

Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134.) The payment of costs is enforceable both as provided in Business

and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
