On December 28, 2011, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (State Bar) filed: (1) a motion seeking an order enrolling attorney William Peter Terhune II (Attorney Terhune II) as an inactive member of the State Bar of California pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6007, subdivision (b)(2) and rules 5.180 et seq. of the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar (motion); and (2) a request for judicial notice in support of its motion for Attorney Terhune II's involuntary inactive enrollment (request). A copy of the motion and the request was properly served by certified mail, return receipt requested, on December 21, 2011, on Roy E. Ogden, Attorney Terhune II's counsel. No response to the motion or request was filed on behalf of Attorney Terhune II, and the time to do so has now expired.

Attached to the State Bar's request is a copy of a superior court order assuming jurisdiction over Attorney Terhune II's law practice, issued by the Honorable Jac Crawford on December 14, 2011, in *In the Matter of the Assumption of Jurisdiction Over the Law Practice of*

William Peter Terhune, II, State Bar Membership No. 129210, San Luis Obispo County Superior Court, case No. CV 110384.¹ The superior court assumed jurisdiction over Attorney Terhune II's practice under Business and Professions Code section 6190 et seq. The superior court's order does not provide for any exceptions to the court's assumption of jurisdiction over Attorney Terhune II's practice.

The court finds that the evidence clearly and convincingly shows that an order involuntarily enrolling Attorney Terhune II as an inactive member of the State Bar of California is appropriate under Business and Professions Code section 6007, subdivision (b)(2). (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.182(A).)

ORDER

The court orders that the State Bar's December 28, 2011 motion for involuntary inactive enrollment and request for judicial notice are GRANTED. Accordingly, the court further orders that Attorney William Peter Terhune II be involuntarily enrolled as an inactive member of the State Bar of California (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 6007, subd. (b)(2)) effective three days after service of this order by mail (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.184.)
