On June 11, 2012, we issued an order placing respondent on interim suspension after his conviction under Penal Code section 530.5, subdivision (a). On June 20, 2012, respondent filed a motion for abatement or, alternatively, for an order directing hearing department to resolve factual issues. On June 27, 2012, the State Bar filed its response. On June 29, 2012, we temporarily stayed the interim suspension order pending our ruling on respondent's motion.

Finding no good cause, respondent's motion is denied. Penal Code section 530.5, subdivision (a), is a crime that inherently involves moral turpitude, and a probable cause hearing on the issue of moral turpitude is unnecessary. This ruling is made without prejudice to any subsequent motion to lift the interim suspension order based on all relevant factors, including any proposed discipline. We will take no further action pending evidence of finality of respondent's conviction, or waiver of finality. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.344(B).) The temporary stay is lifted, and respondent's suspension will be effective July 23, 2012.

Respondent must comply with the California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of his suspension.
