On June 11, 2012, we issued an order placing respondent on interim suspension after his conviction under Penal Code section 530.5, subdivision (a). On July 16, 2012, respondent filed a motion to postpone interim suspension and to lift interim suspension based upon finality of conviction. On June 23, 2012, the State Bar filed its response. On July 19, 2012, we temporarily stayed the interim suspension order pending our ruling on respondent's motion.

Finding no good cause, respondent's motion is denied and the temporary stay is lifted. However, to provide sufficient time to prepare, respondent's suspension will be effective September 15, 2012. Respondent must comply with the California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivision (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 days, respectively, after the effective date of his suspension.

As the judgment of conviction of respondent for a misdemeanor violation of Penal Code section 530.5, subdivision (a), a crime involving moral turpitude, is final and it appearing that the statutory criteria for summary disbarment are not met, this case is referred to the hearing department under the authority of California Rules of Court, rule 9.10(a), for a hearing and decision recommending discipline to be imposed.
