On January 28, 2015, Respondent filed a motion seeking relief from the order assessing costs in the above matter. More specifically, Respondent asks that this court delay and create a four-year installment plan for payments of the costs currently owed by him. Those costs are stated to be \$18,457.30. In support of his motion, Respondent provided a financial statement showing his present financial inability to pay the required costs.

On February 24, 2015, the State Bar notified the court of its non-opposition to the motion.

GOOD CAUSE having been shown, the motion seeking a four-year installment plan is granted. Hence, one-fourth of the currently outstanding costs must be paid by Respondent on or before June 15, 2015. The remaining three equal payments must be paid by Respondent with his membership fees for each of the years 2016, 2017, and 2018. If Respondent fails to pay any of the above installment payments more than 10 days after its due date without the prior written approval of the State Bar or the State Bar Court, the remaining unpaid balance of the costs is due immediately and is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**
