On January 15, 2015, respondent Sean Donrad, by counsel Megan Zavieh, filed a motion for relief from costs awarded in the captioned three not-consolidated disciplinary matters on the grounds of financial hardship. On January 21, 2015, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel, by Catherine Taylor, filed opposition to such relief but indicated no opposition to an extension of time to pay the costs in installments.

Having considered the parties' contentions, the court DENIES the motion for relief from costs, but, alternatively, on the grounds of financial hardship, GRANTS an extension of time to pay the costs awarded in the captioned matters in four annual installments commencing with respondent's membership fees in 2016. Therefore, in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, one-fourth of the costs must be paid with petitioner's membership fees for the years 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019. It is further ordered that if respondent does not pay any

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installment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134.) The payment of costs is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.
