On April 26, 2013, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (State Bar) filed a motion seeking an order enrolling attorney Louise A. Judkins as an inactive member of the State Bar of California pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6007, subdivision (b)(2) and rules 5.180 et seq. of the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar (motion).¹ A copy of the motion was properly served on attorney Judkins by certified mail, return receipt requested, on April 26, 2013, at her membership records address² and a courtesy copy was served by mail on attorney Judkins's niece, Cari Inkenbrandt, in Maryland. No response to the motion was filed by attorney Judkins.

¹ The State Bar also requested that the court take judicial notice that a verified application for assumption of jurisdiction over the law practice of Louise A. Judkins was filed on April 25, 2012, and that the Superior Court assumed jurisdiction over the law practice of Louise A. Judkins on May 11, 2012. The court grants the State Bar's request and takes judicial notice of these facts.

² Pursuant to Evidence Code section 452, subdivision (h), the court takes judicial notice of respondent's official membership records address.

Attached to the State Bar's motion is a copy of a superior court order assuming jurisdiction over attorney Judkins's law practice, issued by the Honorable Shelleyanne W. L. Chang on May 11, 2012, in *In the Matter of the Assumption of Jurisdiction over the Law Practice of Louise A. Judkins, State Bar Membership No. 133605*, Sacramento County Superior Court, case No. 34-2012-00123102. The superior court assumed jurisdiction over attorney Judkins's practice under Business and Professions Code sections 6190 et seq. The superior court's order does not provide for any exceptions to the court's assumption of jurisdiction over attorney Judkins's practice.

The court finds that the evidence clearly and convincingly demonstrates that an order involuntarily enrolling attorney Judkins as an inactive member of the State Bar of California is appropriate under Business and Professions Code section 6007, subdivision (b)(2). (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.182(A).)

ORDER

The court orders that the State Bar's April 26, 2013 motion for involuntary inactive enrollment is GRANTED. Accordingly, the court further orders that attorney Louise A. Judkins be involuntarily enrolled as an inactive member of the State Bar of California (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 6007, subd. (b)(2)) effective three days after service of this order by mail (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.184).

IT IS SO ORDERED.
