ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO MODIFY
STIPULATION RE FACTS, CONCLUSIONS
OF LAW AND DISPOSITION

On June 8, 2015, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (“State Bar”), by and through Deputy Trial Counsel Jamie J. Kim, filed a motion for modification of the stipulation re facts, conclusions of law and disposition (“Stipulation”), approved by this court on May 12, 2015. The State Bar sought modification of the Stipulation due to the inadvertent omission of an “X” in subsection E, subsection 1 on page 5 of the Stipulation, which provides “[D]uring the probation period, Respondent must comply with the provisions of the State Bar Act and Rules of Professional Conduct.”¹ Respondent’s counsel filed an opposition on June 22, 2015.

For good cause shown, the State Bar’s motion for modification of the Stipulation is
GRANTED.


