The record of conviction reflects that the above-named member of the State Bar was convicted as follows:

Convicting court: Superior Court of California, County of Los Angeles

Case number(s): BA421139

Crime(s) of which convicted and classification(s): Violation of California Penal Code § 475(c) (Forgery), one count, a felony which involves moral turpitude as in *In re Paguirigian* (2001) 25 Cal. 4th 1. Further, Penal Code section 475(c) requires as an element of the offense that it be committed with the specific intent to defraud and thus, as it is a felony conviction, this is a matter qualifying for summary disbarment under Business and Professions Code section 6102(c). See also, *Tall v. Mukasey*, 517 F.3d 1115, 1119 (9th Cir. 2008).

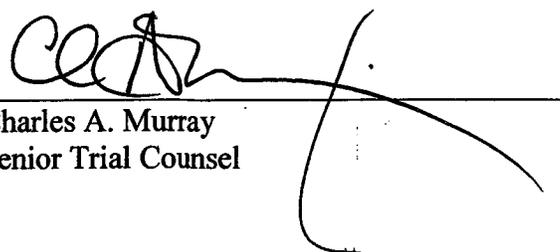
