On December 2, 2015, respondent Elisa Ann Castro (respondent) filed a motion, based on financial hardship, seeking a three-year extension of time to pay disciplinary costs imposed in the above-entitled matter.¹

On December 11, 2015, the State Bar of California, Office of the Chief Trial Counsel (State Bar), filed a pleading indicating that it did not oppose respondent's motion.


After reviewing the parties' pleadings, the court issues the following orders:

Good cause having been shown, the court **GRANTS** respondent an extension of time to comply with the order to pay disciplinary costs. The court **ORDERS** that respondent's time to pay the disciplinary costs associated with case No. 14-O-02079 is extended, and that one-third of said costs is to be paid with respondent's annual State Bar membership fees for the years 2017, 2018, and 2019. The court further **ORDERS** that if respondent

fails to pay any installment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134). The payment of costs remains enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.
