This is Respondent Emory Luther King, Jr.'s second request for relief from costs. On June 28, 2017, the court granted Respondent an extension of time to pay his disciplinary costs in five installments: one-fifth of the costs must be paid with his annual State Bar membership fee for each of the years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023.

On November 26, 2018, Respondent filed a motion for reconsideration for relief from costs based on financial hardship. In his declaration, Respondent incorrectly declared that the court previously ordered him to pay the costs in three installments for the years 2019, 2020, and 2021.

On December 11, 2018, Senior Trial Counsel Johnna G. Sack of the Office of Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (OCTC) opposed the motion, arguing that Respondent's financial situation has not changed significantly since he filed his first motion for relief from costs in May 2017.



Based on Respondent's continued financial hardship, the court hereby GRANTS Respondent an additional year to commence payment of his disciplinary costs, but DENIES his

motion for reconsideration for relief from costs.

Accordingly, the court ORDERS that Respondent's time during which to pay the

disciplinary costs is extended and that one-fifth of the costs must be paid with Emory Luther

King, Jr.'s annual State Bar membership fee for each of the years 2020, 2021, 2022, 2023, and

2024. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 6086.10, subd. (c); Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.130(B).) If

Respondent fails to pay any installment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein, the

remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule

5.134.) Until they are paid in full, the costs remain enforceable both as provided in Business and

Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment. Unless ordered otherwise, this court

will reject any further motion from Respondent regarding payment of disciplinary costs arising

from this matter.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
