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On May 11, 2017, Katayoun T. Fazli (Respondent), by and through her counsel of record, Brandon Howard, Esq., filed a motion requesting relief from or, in the alternative, an extension of time to pay the disciplinary costs assessed in the Hearing Department Decision, entered in the above-captioned matter. Respondent sought relief due to financial hardship.

On June 6, 2017, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel (OCTC), by and through Deputy Trial Counsel Ann J. Kim, filed a response to Respondent's motion. The OCTC did not oppose Respondent's request for an extension of time to pay the disciplinary costs but did argued that Respondent has not shown good cause for relief from payment of the disciplinary costs.

Based on the Court's review of Respondent's motion, her unsworn declaration and the State Bar's response, the Court finds that Respondent has established a level of hardship, special circumstances, and other good cause under rule 5.130(B) of the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar as to warrant the following order:

1. Respondent is granted an extension of time to pay the disciplinary costs. In view of Respondent's financial hardship, the court orders Respondent to pay one-fourth of the disciplinary costs by February 1<sup>st</sup> of 2018, 2019, 2020 and 2021 pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6086.10. The payment of costs is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**
