2. Respondent failed to file a declaration of compliance with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20 in conformity with the requirements of Rule 9.20(c) with the clerk of the State Bar Court by November 18, 2015, as required by Supreme Court Order no. S225439, in willful violation of California Rules of Court, rule 9.20. (A true and correct copy of the rule 9.20 order is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and is incorporated by reference.)

The petition for review is denied.

The court orders that Robert G. Scurrah, Jr., State Bar Number 82766, is suspended from the practice of law in California for one year, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and he is placed on probation for two years subject to the following conditions:

1. Robert G. Scurrah, Jr. is suspended from the practice of law for a minimum of the first 90 days of probation, and he will remain suspended until the following conditions are satisfied:

- i. He makes restitution to the following payees (or reimburses the Client Security Fund, to the extent of any payment from the fund to the payees, in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6140.5) and furnishes proof to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles:
 - (1) Mary von Goetz in the amount of \$3,467 plus 10 percent interest per year from July 5, 2011;
 - (2) Teresa Orcini in the amount of \$4,295 plus 10 percent interest per year from March 21, 2011;
 - (3) Anthony Giordano in the amount of \$2,995 plus 10 percent interest per year from June 23, 2011;
 - (4) Hassan Fallah in the amount of \$3,495 plus 10 percent interest per year from September 16, 2011;
 - (5) Jose Frias in the amount of \$3,795 plus 10 percent interest per year from September 20, 2011;
 - (6) Judy Garza-Rosel in the amount of \$3,495 plus 10 percent interest per year from November 9, 2011;
 - (7) Hal Bringman in the amount of \$5,400 plus 10% interest per year from January 13, 2012; and

ii. If he remains suspended for two years or more as a result of not satisfying the preceding requirement, he must also provide proof to the State Bar Court of his rehabilitation, fitness to practice and learning and ability in the general law. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, tit. IV, Stds. for Atty. Sanctions for Prof. Misconduct, std. 1.2(c)(1).)

2. Robert G. Scurrah, Jr. must comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Review Department of the State Bar Court in its Opinion filed on February 12, 2015.

3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if Robert G. Scurrah, Jr. has complied with all conditions of probation, the period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

Robert G. Scurrah, Jr. must also take and pass the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination within one year of the effective date of this order or during the period of his actual suspension, whichever is longer, and provide satisfactory proof of such passage to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles within the same period. Failure to do so may result in suspension. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 9.10(b).)

Robert G. Scurrah, Jr. must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order. Failure to do so may result in disbarment or suspension.


