The State Bar of California alleges:

JURISDICTION

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1. DALE IRVING GUSTIN ("respondent") was admitted to the practice of law in the State of California on December 21, 1977, was a member at all times pertinent to these charges, and is currently a member of the State Bar of California.

COUNT ONE Case No. 16-N-10867 California Rules of Court, rule 9.20 [Failure to Obey Rule 9.20]

2. Respondent failed to file a declaration of compliance with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20 in conformity with the requirements of rule 9.20(c) with the clerk of the State Bar Court by November 18, 2015, as required by Supreme Court order no. S226413, in willful violation of California Rules of Court, rule 9.20. (A true and correct copy of the rule 9.20 order is attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and is incorporated by reference.)

COUNT TWO Case No. 16-N-10867 Business and Professions Code, section 6106 [Moral Turpitude]

3. On or about December 3, 2015, respondent stated in writing, in his pleading entitled "Declaration of Compliance With Rule 9.20 Regarding Notice to Clients and Withdrawal From All Cases Pending as of June 30, 2015 and the Ruling in the Supreme Court Order Filed September 9, 2015," filed on or about February 22, 2015 in the State Bar Court, that, as of June 30, 2014, he "has performed no legal work for any of his clients that had pending cases in which he was the Attorney of Record or for any other persons," when respondent knew or was grossly negligent in not knowing the statement was false, and thereby committed an act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty or corruption in wilful violation of Business and Professions Code, section 6106.

In re DALE IRVING GUSTIN on Discipline.

The motion to strike is denied.

The petition for review is denied.

The court orders that Dale Irving Gustin, State Bar Number 76642, is suspended from the practice of law in California for two years, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and he is placed on probation for three years subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Dale Irving Gustin is suspended from the practice of law for the first six months of probation;
- 2. Dale Irving Gustin must comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Hearing Department of the State Bar Court in its Decision filed on February 12, 2015; and
- 3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if Dale Irving Gustin has complied with all conditions of probation, the period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

Dale Irving Gustin must also take and pass the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination within one year after the effective date of this order and provide satisfactory proof of such passage to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles within the same period. Failure to do so may result in suspension. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 9.10(b).)

Dale Irving Gustin must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order. Failure to do so may result in disbarment or suspension.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

Werdegar, J., was absent and did not participate.
