On June 18, 2018, respondent Gabriel Dorman (respondent) sought relief from or an extension of time to comply with the order assessing disciplinary costs in the State Bar Court case numbers referenced in the caption above. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.130.) Respondent's motion was based on financial hardship. (See Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.130(B).) On June 21, 2018, the Office of Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (OCTC) filed a response. In its response, the OCTC opposed full or partial relief from costs, but did not oppose an extension of time to pay.


After reviewing the parties' pleadings, the court issues the following orders:

1. Respondent's motion for full or partial relief from payment of disciplinary costs is **DENIED**, no good cause having been shown; and
2. Good cause having been shown, the court **GRANTS** an extension of time for respondent to comply with the order to pay disciplinary costs. The court orders that respondent's time to pay the remaining disciplinary costs be extended and that one-third of said costs is to be paid with respondent's annual State Bar membership fees for the years 2020, 2021, and 2022. The court further **ORDERS** that if respondent fails to pay any installment of disciplinary costs

within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134). The payment of costs remains enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
