This matter is before the court on Joseph Keith Ferreira's December 22, 2009 motion for relief from the obligation to pay the \$2,669 in disciplinary costs that were imposed on him in this proceeding under the Supreme Court's December 2, 1992 order in *In re Joseph Keith Ferreira on Discipline*, case number S028959 (State Bar Court case number 90-O-14204).¹ On January 7, 2010, the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (State Bar) filed an opposition to Ferreira's motion.²

¹ Ferreira included the present motion in the motion for relief from obligation to pay costs that he filed in case number 93-N-12113 (S037362) on December 22, 2009. 
Ferreira failed to establish grounds of hardship, special circumstances, or other good cause sufficient to waive all or part of the \$2,669 in costs. Nonetheless, Ferreira has established sufficient financial hardship to grant him an extension of time to pay the costs.

ORDER

The court orders that Joseph Keith Ferreira's December 22, 2009 motion for relief from obligation to pay disciplinary costs is GRANTED to the extent that, because of financial hardship, the time in which he must pay the \$2,669 in costs is extended as follows. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 6086.10, subd. (c); Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 282.) Joseph Keith Ferreira must pay a minimum of \$300 every six months until the entire \$2,669 is paid (about five years). The payments are due no later than the 10th day of each January and July and must be submitted directly to the State Bar's Membership Billing Office in San Francisco. The first payment is due no later than July 10, 2010.

The court further orders that, if Joseph Keith Ferreira fails to make any payment within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, subdivision (c), and Rules of Procedure of the State Bar, rule 282, the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately and is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.
