On October 10, 2013, respondent Johanna Danielle Hoffmann (Respondent) filed a motion, based on financial hardship, seeking relief from disciplinary costs imposed in the above-entitled matter, or an extension of time to pay such costs. Despite the caption of the motion, however, it appears that Respondent is seeking full relief from the disciplinary costs.


On October 23, 2018, the State Bar of California, Office of Chief Trial Counsel (OCTC), filed a response to Respondent's motion. In its response, the OCTC opposed Respondent's request for full relief from the payment of disciplinary costs, waived objection to Respondent's alleged untimely filing of the motion, and did not oppose the court granting a payment plan to allow Respondent additional time to pay such costs.

After reviewing and considering Respondent's motion and the OCTC's opposition thereto, the court finds that good cause exists to GRANT Respondent partial relief from the assessed disciplinary costs and an extension of time to pay those costs.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the costs awarded in this matter be reduced by one-third (\$3,582.67); and that Respondent's time to pay the disciplinary costs associated with case No. 15-O-15617; 17-O-00526 (cons.)-PEM be extended, one-fifth of said costs to be paid with

Respondent's annual State Bar licensing fees for each of the years 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023. If Respondent fails to pay any installment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134). The payment of costs remains enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.


