On March 2, 2015, Jack Marvin Winick (“Respondent”), sought relief from an order assessing disciplinary costs in State Bar Court Case No. 12-O-16401 (S214809) on the grounds of financial hardship. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.130(B).) Respondent sought a reduction in the \$5,418 he was ordered to pay for discipline costs, the opportunity to make monthly payments and to waive or satisfy the MPRE, State Bar Ethics School and State Bar Client Trust Accounting requirements by internet or other form of study and testing.

March 4, 2015, Anand Kumar, Deputy Trial Counsel of the Office of the Chief Trial Counsel of the State Bar of California (“State Bar”) filed an opposition to Respondent’s request to reduce the amount of disciplinary costs below \$3,419 but did not oppose reduction of the disciplinary costs to that figure or an extension of time for Respondent to pay the \$3,419.

March 4, 2015, Terri Goldade, Supervising Attorney of the Office of Probation, filed an opposition to Respondent’s request to modify the MPRE, Ethics School and Client Trust Accounting requirements.

After reviewing the parties' pleadings, the court issues the following orders:

1. Respondent's motion for reduction in the amount of disciplinary costs is **GRANTED** for good cause shown. Respondent's is ordered to pay \$3,419 in disciplinary costs.


2. Respondent's motion for extension of time to comply with the order to pay disciplinary costs is **GRANTED**. The court orders that Respondent's time to pay the disciplinary costs associated with State Bar Court Case No. 12-O-16401 be extended by two years from the date of filing of the present order. In view of petitioner's financial hardship and good cause appearing, the court **ORDERS** Respondent to pay the disciplinary costs in monthly installments of \$150 per month, commencing January 6, 2016, until paid in full.

It is further **ORDERED** that if Respondent fails to pay any monthly payment of disciplinary costs within the time provided herein or as may be modified by the State Bar Court pursuant to section 6086.10, subdivision (c), the remaining balance of the costs is due and payable immediately unless relief has been granted under the Rules of Procedure of the State Bar of California. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, rule 5.134.) The payment of costs is enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment.

3. In all other respects, Respondent's motion is **DENIED**.

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**


