In re ANANA JOHARI RICE on Discipline

The court orders that Anana Johari Rice, State Bar Number 209795, is suspended from the practice of law in California for two years, execution of that period of suspension is stayed, and she is placed on probation for two years subject to the following conditions:

1. Anana Johari Rice is suspended from the practice of law for a minimum of the first year of probation, and she will remain suspended until the following requirements are satisfied:
 - i. She makes restitution to the following payees (or reimburses the Client Security Fund, to the extent of any payment from the fund to the payees, in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6140.5) and furnishes proof to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles:
 - (1) Alyce Bailey in the amount of \$1,150 plus 10 percent interest per year from November 7, 2012;
 - (2) Hui Sing Chang in the amount of \$3,000 plus 10 percent interest per year from March 17, 2012;
 - (3) Maria Cabunag in the amount of \$3,900 plus 10 percent interest per year from January 1, 2013; and
 - (4) George Collado and Jennifer Larson in the amount of \$450 plus 10 percent interest per year from January 10, 2013.

- ii. If she remains suspended for two years or more as a result of not satisfying the preceding condition, she must also provide proof to the State Bar Court of her rehabilitation, fitness to practice and learning and ability in the general law before her suspension will be terminated. (Rules Proc. of State Bar, tit. IV, Stds. for Atty. Sanctions for Prof. Misconduct, std. 1.2(c)(1).)
2. Anana Johari Rice must also comply with the other conditions of probation recommended by the Hearing Department of the State Bar Court in its Order Approving Stipulation filed on March 11, 2014.
3. At the expiration of the period of probation, if Anana Johari Rice has complied with all conditions of probation, the two-year period of stayed suspension will be satisfied and that suspension will be terminated.

Anana Johari Rice must also take and pass the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination within one year after the effective date of this order, or during the period of her suspension, whichever is longer and provide satisfactory proof of such passage to the State Bar's Office of Probation in Los Angeles within the same period. Failure to do so may result in suspension. (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 9.10(b).)

Anana Johari Rice must also comply with California Rules of Court, rule 9.20, and perform the acts specified in subdivisions (a) and (c) of that rule within 30 and 40 calendar days, respectively, after the effective date of this order. Failure to do so may result in disbarment or suspension.

Costs are awarded to the State Bar in accordance with Business and Professions Code section 6086.10 and are enforceable both as provided in Business and Professions Code section 6140.7 and as a money judgment. One-third of the costs must be paid with her membership fees for each of the years 2015, 2016, and 2017. If Anana Johari Rice fails to pay any installment as described above, or as may be modified by the State Bar Court, the remaining balance is due and payable immediately.
